New Member Survey: March 2024

- AY 2023-2024: 65 new members
- Satisfaction/Expectation
 - 60% classes exceeded expectation
 - 99% exceeded or met
- Remote viewing: 56% occasionally
- Key benefits of membership
 - 100%: flexibility/no-registration required
 - 50%: cited 'opportunity to meet new people'
 - 41%: Quest Extra/extracurricular activities





THE QUEST HYBRID EXPERIENCE



March 13, 2020:

COVID shuts down Quest – remaining spring semester classes canceled

Do We Wait Out COVID?





Is Zoom the Answer?

March 20, 2020:

A dozen Quest members volunteer for hastily formed Zoom Committee



Most have little or no Zoom experience

May 26, 2020:

Quest begins successful summer Zoom program

Summer 2020:

Upcoming fall classes at 25 Broadway canceled

35-course fall semester scheduled to run fully on Zoom



FALL 2020:

Zoom-only classes go well

Tech issues lessen as semester progresses

Many Quest members plagued by "cabin fever"




Will we have to do this again in the spring?

Spring 2021:

Quest cancels spring 2021 classes. Zoom-only continues

Quest explores hybrid options for the fall

Approves \$30K for upgrading equipment for fall hybrids



Spring 2021:

Tech team faced with new learning curve

Many members still reluctant to attend in-person

Quest approves an ambitious experiment – *nearly all its fall* 2021 classes to be hybrid




A mistake?

Fall 2021/Spring 2022:

Hybrid approach successful

Many classes also recorded

"Zoom-only" memberships offered



Few – if any – lifelong learning centers offer as many hybrids

Fall 2021/Spring 2022:

However, far fewer Quest members attending inperson classes

Also difficulties attracting new members



Question – Have we made it too easy for Quest members to stay home?

Fall 2022/Spring 2023:

To counter low in-person attendance, hybrids scaled back to 60% of all courses. No Zoom-only classes




Blowback from membership

Question: By offering fewer hybrids is Quest unfairly impacting those unable to attend in person?

Fall 2022/Spring 2023:

In-person attendance skyrockets to near pre-COVID levels




Marketing efforts and reduced COVID concerns spark interest from New York retirees seeking educational and social opportunities

Fall 2023/Spring 2024:

Using federal grants, CCNY invests \$300K to upgrade its ten-year-old tech equipment

Our tech team expands and Quest hires full-time CCNY technical assistant



Fall 2023/Spring 2024:

Percentage of hybrids offered continues at 60%

Few complaints from members

Membership soars from 205 to 270 (our current max)



Most new members far more attracted to social interaction than hybrids

The Future?

- Quest will continue its:
 - √ hybrid program
 - √ tech investments
 - √ course recordings but fewer
- More tech volunteers needed
 - Increase in 270 membership cap likely
